WATERFORD'S EDC BOOST

Through the Small Business Grant Program, in 2023, the Town of Waterford's Economic Planning and Development Department has distributed over \$170,000 in grants to 18 local business owners as part of its S ongoing commitment to support local businesses economically impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. This exciting news demonstrates their dedication to helping the community thrive during these difficult times.





Thanks to the American Rescue Plan Act's funding, Waterford Small Business Grant Program, implemented in partnership with the Economic Development Commission and Brianna Régine Visionary Consulting (BRVC), has now awarded a of \$170,065.01 sum businesses bounce back from financial hardships. In 2022, the program provided \$78,500.00 to the first cohort of eight recipients, and its success spurred additional funding for a second cohort in 2023.

Cohort 1 of the Small Business Grant Program awarded eight grants to A Cut Above Hair Design, LLC, Utopia Salon, Dream In Color Marketing, LLC, Millaras Piggery, LLC, Waterford Gymnastics Center, Nana's Byrek, LLC, Filomena's, LLC, and Ivy's Simply Homemade, LLC.
